

The numbers of immediately notifiable diseases under IDSR 002 are shown below in section 2. Overall, reportable diseases under surveillance represented 81% of total morbidity and 60% of total mortality in W11.

Figure 1b | Proportional mortality (W11)










Figure 4a | Age breakdown




Total case fatality due to Acute Watery Diarrhoea in W11 was 0.0%.

Figure 4b | Trend in number of cases over time (Borno State)




Figure 4c | Number of cases by LGA





Figure 5c | Number of cases by LGA





Total case fatality due to SAM in W11 was 0.1%.





Figure 6c | Number of cases by LGA







All cause trends by LGA show





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



Figure 9e | Maiduguri
